GUIDELINES

Deadline for applications: 15 January, 2010

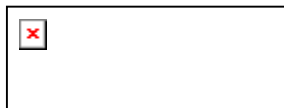
General guidance notes:

1. The ECPR's mobility fund is available to graduate students and young scholars (see below) from ECPR member institutions* who are self-funded and have been accepted to participate in a workshop at the 2010 Joint Sessions of Workshops in Münster, Germany.
2. Grants are limited to no more than one person per member institution.
3. A maximum of €500 will be awarded to successful applicants. This may be used to cover travel and/or accommodation costs.
4. Applications must be received by the ECPR Central Services by 1700 hrs on 15 January, 2010. Applicants will be informed of the outcome of their application on 29 January 2010.
5. Applications may be sent by email to ecpr@essex.ac.uk, posted to our central services office or faxed to 0044 1206 872500 by the applicant. N.B: There is no need to go through the ECPR Official Representative.
6. The grant will be paid AFTER the Joint Sessions have taken place upon production of proof of student status, proof of self-funding, receipts and a copy of the paper presented. Where the full costs of accommodation or travel are covered, original tickets and receipts are required.

Selection/eligibility criteria:

1. Applicants must at the time of the Joint Sessions be registered PhD students at an ECPR member (or associate member) institution.
2. Grants will not be awarded to anyone who has received an ECPR mobility fund award within the past year.
3. Only students who are self-funded (i.e. whose institution is not contributing towards travel and/or accommodation expenses) are eligible to apply. Therefore, evidence (a letter from the student's supervisor and head of department) must also be provided, confirming that the recipient of the grant is self-funded.
4. Applicants must be presenting a paper and where that paper is co-authored, must be the presenter of that paper.
5. Priority will be given to student applicants who are more advanced in their research.
